Last month, you saw what happens when JFA trains high school students. This month image you eavesdropped on my conversations. If you were a mouse with me next to the Justice For All Exhibit in Arizona you would have heard...



**"I don't like abortion, but it's not a right we can take away from women."**

...75 minutes later, \*Micah and I discussed the existence of God.  
...2 hours after the start of the conversation we exchanged e-mails in order to continue our dialogue.

(my response) **"If a woman has a two year old child she doesn't want, can she kill that child? Is that a right we can take away from her? If so, why?"**  
(\*Micah) **"Yes, that is a right we can take away because the two year old is a human being. (Micah paused to think) Oh...I see why you feel the way you do. If the unborn is human it should be protected like the two year old. But is it really human in the beginning stages of development?"**  
(45 minutes later, \*Micah) **"Ok, my mind has changed about abortion. Thanks for not bringing God into the subject."**
